

#### **BOARD REPORT**

I am very happy to let you all know that the new boiler heating system for the chapel that we have been working on for well over a year has been installed and is working wonderfully well. The very cold weather this winter will put it to the test but we have every confidence in our new system which now heats our main bathrooms as well as the chapel.

Speaking of bathrooms, the BOT has authorized repairs to the dysfunctional bathrooms in our Administrative Wing, as well as needed minor repairs to our main bathrooms and the kitchen sink which should be completed by early March.

The Facilities Task Force had their first meeting of the year and will begin reviewing the report from the Wendel Architectural and Engineering firm that was authorized by the congregation in 2024. There will be meetings and conversations regarding the future of our facilities throughout the year with any decision on how to proceed to be made by a congregational vote.

Linda Gardner and Bruce Becker are to be commended for their long (44 months) of service on the BOT and we welcome Ruth Bowen and Charlie D'estries as they take their places on this year's board.

We continue to add members to our congregation and look forward to continuing our progress in this our 71st year.

# The Work That Reconnects Immersion Workshop Sunday, April 6th, Noon to 4:00 pm Emerson Room

Opt-in to a life sustaining world! The Work That Reconnects (WTR) is a framework and set of practices developed by eco-Buddhist scholar and humanitarian, Joanna Macy. It is a holistic approach to personal and collective transformation that aims to address the ecological and social challenges facing humanity. It provides a safe and supportive space for individuals to explore and express their emotions about the state of the world, while also fostering a sense of connection and empowerment.



You are warmly welcomed to explore WTR through embodied practices to inspire actionable hope. During this immersive session, participants will explore moving through the components of the Spiral of The Work That Reconnects: Ground in Gratitude; Honoring Our Pain; Seeing With New Eyes; Going Forth.

The Practices That Guide Us Through the Spiral: Somatic Movement: Grounding/Tapping Practices, Body Movement, Breath-work; Simple Songs; Facilitated Conversations & Small Group Discussions; Guided Meditations.

A light lunch will be served at noon. The workshop begins at 12:30 pm. Beverages will be available throughout the afternoon.

I overheard one man exclaim "Thank you for this!" both as he arrived and as he left. Donors and volunteers, we're making a difference in people's lives!



#### CARING FOR ONE ANOTHER RECIPES

Christine Boczarska and Faith Pham are sisters and dedicated members of our Caring For One Another group. They provide occasional meals to UU Amherst members on an as-needed basis. With the meal they generally include a "goodie bag" and a card on behalf of the Caring Group. Each month you'll find one of their healthy recipes here in *The Foreword* often incorporating fresh vegetables and even gluten-free.

#### Spring Lemon Ricotta Pasta

Recipe from Dash's Market

2 Tbsp extra virgin olive oil

1 cup panko crumbs

1/2-1 tsp crushed red pepper flakes

3/4 lb of angel hair pasta

Kosher salt and black pepper

6 Tbsp cold salted butter

1 lemon, sliced, seeds removed

1 cup fresh basil, chopped

1 zucchini or yellow summer squash, very thinly sliced

3-4 cloves garlic, minced or grated

2 Tbsp fresh thyme leaves (or 2 tsp dried thyme)

8 oz ricotta cheese, whipped if desired



Heat a large skillet over medium heat. Add the olive oil, the breadcrumbs, and crushed red pepper flakes. Cook, stirring occasionally util the breadcrumbs are toasted all over, about 4 minutes. Remove the breadcrumbs from the skillet. Lastly season with salt.

Bring a large pot of salted water to a boil. Cook the pasta according to package directions until al dente. Drain.

Meanwhile, set your skillet over medium-high heat. Add the 2 tablespoons of butter and lemon slices. Sear until the lemon is caramelized, about 1 minute per side. Remove the lemon from the skillet. Finely chop the lemon slices and mix with the basil.

To the skillet, add the remaining butter, zucchini, garlic, and thyme. Season with salt and pepper. Cook until the zucchini is golden, 5 minutes. Watch the garlic closely. Remove from the heat, stir in the pasta and half of the lemon/basil.

Spread the ricotta into bowls. Add the pasta. Top with breadcrumbs and additional lemon/basil.
